GENERAL DISCUSSION AND PUBLIC INPUT:

 During introductions, Stan asked Tim Walters to elaborate on his background in fisheries and his current position with ODFW.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Stan Petrowski

- Stan attended the Network of Oregon Watersheds outreach workshop in Medford along with Brian Swift and Dave Loomis. It was shocking to Stan to learn that research showed outreach for non-profits needed to be geared toward the sixth grade learning level.
- The South Umpqua Rural Community Partnership (SURCP), a 501-c-3 non-profit, of which Stan is president, is
 interested in discussing with the PUR board the opportunity to be a sub-council under the PUR umbrella. This
 small grassroots group is especially interested in restoration in the Upper South Umpqua and its tributaries,
 especially Elk Creek.

STAFF REPORT:

- Bob Kinyon, Coordinator:
 - Continued coordination with Brian Swift, the new Smith River WC coordinator, who started his new job on January 4th. Worked out details of draft MOU between PUR and the SRWC with Paul Dailey.
 - Completed MOU between SRWC and PUR to work collaboratively with Brian on training and mentoring.
 - Completed executive director article for the next PUR newsletter.
 - Coordinated venue at Sutherlin for the December council meeting.
 - Conference call with Sandy, Jake Winn and INR staff regarding a changeover of the Umpqua Explorer to open source software. It will make the website more flexible and efficient.
 - Worked with Paul Heberling to rescue a lost EPA-319 grant application that was captured in a junk email file at DEQ headquarters in Eugene. Thanks to his efforts the proposal finally got in to the queue.
 - Met with Tracy, Debbie and Terry to discuss and re-format a finance committee proposal for staff benefits.
 - Circulated a spreadsheet to staff and agency reps with 14 active grants needing a final report in 2010.
 - Confirmed with Bruce Miller, ODFW research biologist from the Charleston office, that he would be the

 meetings on the W. Fork Smith River instream project since Bruce has been doing intensive fish survey work
 on the West Fork for several years.
 - Attended education committee meeting at PUR on January 5th. Discussed development of two resolutions for the board plus a discussion on leasing water rights to instream use via The Fresh Water Trust. There were 11 members in attendance.
 - Spent one day doing photo documentation of 9 projects across the basin for OWEB monitoring reports.
 - Attended Lunch Bunch presentation on "biofuels development on the Umpqua" at the Roseburg Country Club. There were several PUR members in attendance.
 - Met with Chris Frissell of the Pacific Rivers Council to discuss a project on Canton Creek on the North Umpqua.
 - Participated in the Events Committee meeting at PUR on the 13th.

Terry Burleson, Planner :

- Developed a large-scale spreadsheet for the conference room wall to track active and potential projects.

Matt Ruwaldt, Wetland Project Manager

- Attended collaboration meeting with ODFW at PUR to discuss potential and future projects.

- Met with Laura Smith, new conservation tech at Umpqua SWCD. Gave her a tour of the Dean Creek restoration projects.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mark Kincaid recommended the board develop a "Don Ollivant Memorial Award", to be given periodically to someone who exemplifies what Don meant to the Partnership - someone who sought scientific solutions to questions; asked penetrating questions; and spoke with conviction. After discussion, Stan made a motion to create the award, Jan provided the second, and the motion passed without objection. Those wishing to help develop the criteria for the award should contact Mark, who will take the lead on this endeavor.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Paul Heberling announced that it is highly likely that EPA will authorize additional funding this year for the Formosa Mine Superfund site for more testing and evaluation.

PRESENTATION(S): Jeff McEnroe, Fisheries Biologist, Roseburg BLM: *Does Streams* + *Wood* = *Fish*? Jeff provided an excellent slide show, identifying the collaborative monitoring ongoing in the Wolf Creek sub-watershed. He listed the various partners (BLM, PUR and ODFW) and described the different kinds of monitoring, i.e. implementation, effectiveness, extensive, intensive, biological and physical with photos, graphs and tables to emphasize each type.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

- Finance Committee: Tracy Pope
 - Tracy convened the finance committee, met with the staff and then developed a resolution to allocate the surplus prudent reserve funding. She emailed the four-page resolution to the board for their consideration prior to today's meeting. Tracy made a motion to approve the allocation of the funding in the following percentages:
 - 1. Growth 30%
 - 2. Projects 15%
 - 3. Health Benefits 45%
 - 4. Business/equipment 10%

Tom Manton seconded the motion. A discussion ensued regarding the type and cost of health benefits. The motion passed via consensus.

- Nominations Committee: Alan Bunce
 - There are still some vacancies on the board that need to be filled. The board members should continue to search for candidates for the vacant positions.
- Technical Advisory (TAC) Committee: Terry Burleson
 - Terry announced that the next TAC meeting will be on January 28th at 1:00 p.m. at the PUR office.
 - The committee will discuss project proposals for the April OWEB offering.
- Events Committee: Richard Chasm
 - Richard emailed a resolution to the board regarding the Partnership taking over the "River Clean Up" event that is held in September every year. The resolution was generated after the event committee met on January 13th to discuss this and other items. Richard moved to accept the resolution. The motion was seconded by Alan Bunce and was approved via consensus. The board noted that this was a great opportunity to clean up the riverbanks; involve the community; work together as council members; and to encourage additional membership.
- Education Committee: Stanley Petrowski
 - The education committee met on January 5th and drafted a two-part resolution, i.e. hire Dave Loomis as the education/outreach program coordinator, and use the RockEd facility as a foundation to take over from the Joe Merchep Umpqua River Foundation. This resolution was emailed to the board for their consideration prior to today's meeting.
 - Stan had several telephone calls from directors who had concerns about this proposal. Rather than engage in a lengthy discussion at the board meeting, the president sent the resolution back to committee for further deliberation. Bob will send a "doodle" to all members to schedule a follow-up education committee meeting prior to the February council meeting. All members who want to have a voice in this decision should plan to attend the education committee meeting.
